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Convention Speakers Bring Range of Concepts, Skills

- Debby Kerr-Henry, a speaker and author. Debby believes leadership begins from within and should be transferred into our homes and communities for the goodness of all. She will share a blueprint for effective leadership that offers modified solutions for post pandemic hurdles.
- Keynote speaker Joscelyn Ramos Campbell, creator of the award-winning website, Mami of Multiples and co-host of the Chicas Chatting podcast. Joscelyn regularly shares tips for parenting-related challenges, including suggestions for meeting the unique needs of children diagnosed with autism and other disabilities. She also plans to celebrate the character, courage, and commitment of parents of multiples.
- A Multiples Panel featuring several sets of twins. Panel members will share their perspectives on navigating childhood, the teen years, and adulthood as a multiple.
