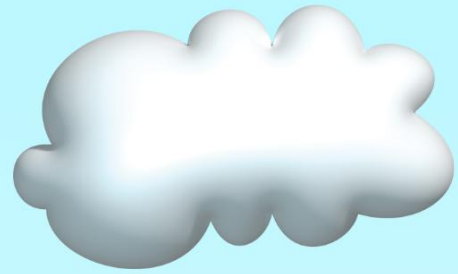

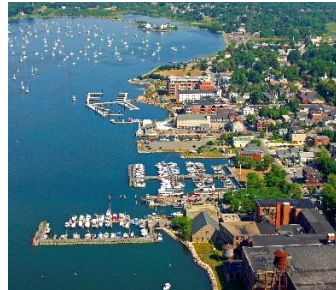

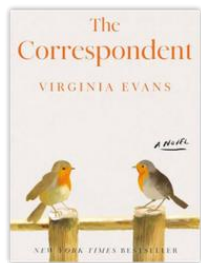

Get to Know our Keynote Speaker: ~ Kellie A. Barhight ~



Kellie A. Barhight is a mother of two sets of twins (just two years apart), and a motivational speaker who is known for her handle Ms. B Positive on Tik Tok.

“Motherhood has been my greatest teacher,” Kellie shares. “And let me tell you, she is a tough instructor. I’ve learned patience (mostly because I have no other choice), flexibility (because plans are just suggestions at this point), and that silence is usually suspicious, not peaceful.”

By day, Kellie is a lieutenant of Operations for the Stow, MA Police Department who specializes in Crisis Intervention and Peer Officer Response. She also teaches veteran police officers and new recruits about mental health.

The EDGE (Enrichment, Development and Growth Endowment) Fund allows for future growth of our organization so we can continue to support our research and education mission. Marge Ainsworth Scholarship Fund

In 1960, Marge Ainsworth had a vision of an organization to support multiple birth families. That dream became a reality, and she was the first president of the National Organization of Mothers of Twins Clubs, Inc. Without her dedication and hard work to bring local clubs together from across the country and forming new clubs, many of us would not have found the support and friendships we have had throughout the years with our local, state and national connections.

Named in her honor, the Marge Ainsworth Scholarship was established in 2015 to identify qualified students from multiple birth families, recognize their accomplishments, and help them achieve their post-secondary education goals.



Donations will be collected throughout Convention, or you can present your club's donation(s) during the General Session. All donations made will be equally divided between the two funds.

2026 Convention Standing Rules

1. Attendees and guests must be registered to attend business meetings or to participate in other scheduled activities.
2. Identification badges issued by the credentials committee shall be worn for admission to all general session/business meetings, polls, workshops, luncheons, and other official events.
3. The President shall appoint a committee of three to approve the convention minutes. There shall be reserved seating for these appointees in the front row, center section of the general session seating area.
4. The President shall appoint official timekeepers to call time during debate and candidate speeches.
5. The President shall appoint official pages to deliver messages during business sessions thereby limiting disruption of those meetings.
6. Delegates, Past Presidents, Board of Directors and National Workers wishing to speak shall line up at the floor microphones. Upon being recognized, members shall state their name and club affiliation, including state.
7. All main motions and amendments shall be presented to the presiding officer in writing and shall be signed by the maker of the motion.
8. All motions to be introduced under New Business shall be presented to the presiding officer, in writing, no later than 12:00 noon on the Friday before the close of convention.
9. The reading of each proposed amendment to the bylaws and/or standing rules will not be required.
10. Proposed bylaw and/or standing rule amendments may be adopted using a consent agenda.
11. An amendment to strike out one word or a set of words in multiple places and to insert a different word or set of words in all those places shall be in order and shall be deemed to include appropriate modifications in capitalization, number (singular or plural), and case (e.g., possessive).
12. Debate shall be limited to fifteen (15) minutes per main motion (excluding proposed amendments to the bylaws and standing rules). Debate shall be limited to ten (10) minutes per proposed bylaw or standing rules amendment. Each club/speaker may speak for no more than two (2) minutes on each debatable question.
13. Voting cards will be used in all meetings as follows:
 - a. Voters will raise voting cards while remaining seated, which will be deemed to be a division of the assembly.
 - b. At the request of the chair, voters will stand for verification of votes.
 - c. The presiding officer will direct any necessary change to this procedure, such as a counted rising vote.
 - d. Voters will present their voting cards at the polls to receive ballots.
14. Immediately after nominations are closed for elected officers, each of the nominees shall be given four (4) minutes to address the assembly. Candidates for President shall each be allowed six (6) minutes to speak. Candidates for Nominating Committee/Chair and Scholarship Committee Chair shall each be given three (3) minutes to address the assembly.
15. Cell phones and pagers shall be silenced during all business meetings and workshops.
16. Video cameras and recording equipment, other than that approved by the President, shall not be permitted in the assembly hall or in the workshops.
17. All attendees shall maintain an appropriate tone, refrain from side conversations, and refrain from the use of inappropriate language during general sessions and workshops. Failure to do so may result in removal from the meeting or workshop.

2026 Convention Election Rules

1. **VOTING CARDS.** The Credentials Committee will issue the proper number of voting cards, each card representing one vote, to voting members of the convention body at the time of registration. Each voting card shall be signed by the receiving member.
2. **POLLS.** The time and place for balloting shall be designated by the President. Voters shall be issued one ballot per voting card upon presentation of the voting card and name badge.
3. **BALLOTS.** For each office, candidates nominated by the Nominating Committee shall be listed first, followed by blank spaces to list candidates nominated from the floor. Space shall be provided under each office to write in additional names.
4. **SPOILED BALLOTS.** If a ballot is marked in error or spoiled, it may be returned to a designated teller who shall mark it "SPOILED" and issue another ballot.
5. **ELECTIONEERING.** No electioneering (campaigning) for any candidate shall be allowed.
6. **COUNTING THE VOTE.** The tellers shall count ballots in teams assigned by the Chief Teller. When there is any doubt or disagreement about the marking of a ballot, it shall be set aside for consideration by all tellers and the Chief Teller. A majority vote of these individuals shall decide how the ballot is recorded.
7. **VOTE REQUIRED FOR OFFICER ELECTION.** Election shall be by ballot; nominees shall be in attendance at convention to be nominated from the floor and majority elects. If majority is not obtained on the first ballot, plurality shall elect on the second ballot. A tie vote shall be re-balloted; a second tie shall be decided by lot. Where there is only one nominee for an office, the chair will declare the nominee elected by general consent.
8. **VOTE REQUIRED FOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE CHAIR ELECTION.** Nominating Committee Chair election shall be by ballot; nominees shall be in attendance at convention and majority elects. If majority is not obtained on the first ballot, plurality shall elect on the second ballot. A tie vote shall be re-balloted; a second tie shall be decided by lot. Where there is only one nominee for chair, the chair will declare the nominee elected by general consent.
9. **VOTE REQUIRED FOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE MEMBER ELECTION.** Nominating Committee members shall be elected by plurality vote. To be eligible, members shall have attended a previous convention within the last five (5) years, have served on a National Committee, and have a qualified volunteer form on file with the Nominating Committee. The nominee receiving the sixth (6th) highest vote becomes the alternate. Where there are no more than five (5) nominees, the chair will declare the nominees elected by general consent.
10. **PRESERVATION OF BALLOTS.** Ballots and tally sheets shall be sealed and placed in the custody of the Executive Director to be preserved for 30 days, after which time they shall be destroyed if no election has been contested.

Article VII. NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Nominations

- a) Nominating Committee shall consist of a chair and five (5) committee members elected by the voting body at convention; the five (5) committee members shall each represent a different district. No more than two (2) Past Presidents may serve on the Nominating Committee concurrently.
- b) Nominating Chair: Shall be Officer in Charge of the Nominating Committee and oversee preparation of slate; shall be responsible for the preparation of the eligibility lists and shall actively recruit members to serve in elected and appointed positions.
- c) Committee: To be eligible, shall have attended a previous convention within the last five years, have served on a National Committee, and have a qualified volunteer form on file with the Nominating Committee. Committee shall be elected by plurality vote. The nominee receiving the sixth (6th) highest number of votes shall be the alternate.
- d) At least thirty (30) days prior to the annual convention, the Nominating Committee shall present to the membership an official list of nominees for each elected office.
 - 1) Additional nominations may be made from the convention floor.
 - 2) Nominees must meet qualifications per Article IV, Section 2.
 - 3) Nominees must be in attendance at convention to be nominated from the floor.
 - 4) Nominees presented on the official slate must be in attendance at convention unless a hardship is approved by the Board of Directors, prior to convention. The slated President must always be in attendance due to duties that transfer at convention.

Section 3. Elections

- a) Election shall be by ballot unless there is only one nominee for an office. In such case, the Chair shall declare the nominee elected by general consent.
- b) Majority elects on the first ballot. If a second ballot is necessary, plurality shall elect.
- c) Tie vote shall be re-balloted; a second tie shall be decided by lot.

Article IX. MARGE AINSWORTH SCHOLARSHIP (Scholarship Committee)

Section 1. Mission of Scholarship Committee:

The National Organization of Mothers of Twins Clubs, Inc. Marge Ainsworth Scholarship is named in honor of NOMOTC's 1st President. Established in 2015 to identify qualified students from multiple birth families, recognize their accomplishments, and help them achieve their post-secondary education goals.

Two scholarship categories are available: one for Multiples and one for Parents of Multiples.

Section 2. Committee

- a) **Scholarship Committee Chair** shall be elected by the voting body at convention and shall serve for a three-year term and may be re-elected for one additional term. To be eligible, must have served as a National Worker in good standing for at least three (3) years and have a qualified volunteer form on file with the Nominating Committee exhibiting the qualifications required for office as detailed in the Procedures and Job Descriptions.

Proposed Bylaw and Standing Rules Amendments (p.1)

Proposed Bylaw Amendments

Proposed Bylaw Amendment # 1: Article IV Officers, Section 4, c

Currently Reads: *c) Should the term of office served in filling a vacancy exceed one half the term of office, it shall be considered a full term and the regulation concerning tenure shall apply.*

If amended, shall read: For any Board of Directors position, a full term must be served to receive credit for that year.

Rationale: This change is to reflect current procedure of serving on the Board of Directors after restructuring.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment # 2: Section 5, b, Communication and Marketing Vice President

Currently Reads: *b) **Communication and Marketing Vice President:** Officer responsible for all meeting minutes, as well as is responsible for all formal correspondence, serving as custodian of official records, administrator of social media in conjunction with the Media and Publication Vice President.*

If amended, shall read: *b) **Communication and Marketing Vice President:** Officer responsible for annual meeting minutes, as well as is responsible for all formal correspondence, serving as custodian of official records, administrator of social media in conjunction with the Media and Publication Vice President.*

Rationale: Board of Directors procedures have changed, and board members share the responsibility of monthly meeting minutes.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment # 3: Article V Executive Committee and Board of Directors, Section 2, a

Currently Reads: *a) Shall consist of the Executive Committee and Chair of all Standing Committees.*

If amended, shall read: a) shall consist of the elected officers, Advisor and Parliamentarian.

Rationale: After the restructuring of the Board of Directors, positions have been eliminated. This change will eliminate any confusion in the future.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment # 4: Article V Executive Committee and Board of Directors, Section 2, e

Currently Reads: *e) Appointed Officers, ~~Appointed Chair of Standing Committees and Committees~~ shall be appointed yearly and may not serve more than five (5) consecutive years in the same position. One term must pass before the member is eligible to serve in that position again; however, members may immediately serve in any other position for which they are qualified.*

If amended, shall read: e) Appointed Officers shall be appointed yearly and may not serve more than five (5) consecutive years in the same position. One term must pass before the member is eligible to serve in that position again; however, members may immediately serve in any other position for which they are qualified.

Rationale: Appointed Chair of Standing Committees and Committees are no longer Board of Director positions after restructuring was completed several years ago. These positions are outlined in departments that report to the Board of Directors.

Proposed Bylaw and Standing Rules Amendments (p.2)

Proposed Bylaw Amendment # 5: Article XII. 2 b, Executive Office

Currently Reads: *The Executive Director shall supervise and maintain the Executive Office according to law, contract, procedures, and the Executive Committee. She will assure that the President, Finance Vice President, Executive Director, ~~current Convention Chair, and current Convention Treasurer~~ shall be bonded in an amount to be determined by the Executive Committee, with fees paid by the National Organization.*

If amended shall read: The Executive Director shall supervise and maintain the Executive Office according to law, contract, procedures, and the Executive Committee. She will assure that the President, Finance Vice President, Executive Director and **Events Vice President** shall be bonded in an amount to be determined by the Executive Committee, with fees paid by the National Organization.

Rationale: Due to the restructuring of convention, the positions of Convention Chair and Convention Treasurer have been eliminated. This change will reflect the updated restructure of convention.

Proposed Standing Rule Amendment

Proposed Standing Rule Amendment # 1: Standing Rules, III, convention 2(c)

Currently Reads: *For Events Vice President, Finance Vice President and Parliamentarian pays one half (1/2) double room rate for up to five (5) nights unless complimentary. Remaining members of the Board of Directors to receive one half (1/2) double room rate for up to ~~four (4)~~ nights. Newly elected/appointed members of the Board of Directors to receive one half (1/2) double room rate for Sunday night following convention.*

If amended shall read: Board of Directors to receive one half (1/2) of double room rate for up to three (3) nights, **unless complimentary.**

Rationale: Currently this part of Multiples of America Standing Rules does not meet the current convention structure. Post-convention meeting is held a couple of weeks after convention via video conference call (Zoom).

Dear Members,

The proposed budget that follows will be voted on July 25, 2026, during Multiples of America's 65th Annual Convention. Please share this information with your club and discuss in advance. There will be a Zoom Meeting to address questions or comments on July 7, 2026. Below you will find some information to aid in your understanding of the budget proposed for 2026-2027.

Why isn't this a balanced budget?

We continue to see expenses that are greater than income. However, we have sufficient money in our operating account to cover this shortfall. Over the past five years, we have been diligent in containing costs, resulting in excess income. A deficit budget provides transparency about the actual costs of the organization and the need to continue increasing membership and donations.

What do these line items mean?

While some line items are self-explanatory, such as, "Printing & Copying" or "Postage & Shipping," members often have questions about the specifics within Member Club Services and Operating Expenses.

Salary is the amount that the organization pays its one full-time employee, the Executive Director.

Member Club Support is the amount that the organization pays contracted workers to handle specific tasks like Group Exemption and Communications.

Platform Service Fees include the costs of services that the organization needs to do business, such as Internet at the Executive Office, Dropbox and Google Storage, Hootsuite, and Survey Monkey.

Communications includes the costs of items like MailChimp (used for emails) and Zoom.

What are the notable numbers?

Member Dues are calculated based on an estimate of 4,000 club members for 2026-2027. This is a small increase from our current membership, but working together, we can get there!

Non-restricted Donations and **Sponsorships** each have a goal of \$6,000. This is close to what we have raised in years past, but also gives us goals to aim for.

Like businesses everywhere, we face increased **Operations Costs and Operating Expenses**, such as bookkeeping, platform service fees and website support. The prices for these services are set by the vendors. We have attempted to offset these increases by decreasing the amount spent on storage, mileage, postage, supplies and miscellaneous expenses.
